

**SINDH POLICE IS DETERMINED IN ITS DRIVE AGAINST CRIMINALS AND IT WILL STAY UNDETERRED AGAINST ALL ODDS – IGP GHULAM HYDER JAMALI**

**KARACHI, SEP-10:** In a simple ceremony held at the Central Police Office today the Deputy Consul General of Germany Mr. Hans - Juergen Paschke handed over five state of the art *Latent Finger Print Identification Systems, finger print kits and motorcycles* worth about PKR 14,520,660 (*Fourteen million five hundred twenty thousand six hundred & Sixty*) to Mr. Ghulam Hyder Jamali, the Inspector General of Police Sindh.

The forensic equipment and motorcycles were handed over to the Sindh Police on behalf of the German Government under the German Federal Foreign Office Project "*Capacity Development Support to the Sindh Police*". The Project aims at enhancing the professional competency of the Sindh Police through advanced training and infrastructure support. It is fully funded by the German Federal Foreign Office and implemented by the *Deutsche Gesellschaft fuer Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH*.

It is pertinent to point out here that prior to the handing over of the equipment, the Project conducted specialized orientation courses for officers of the Forensic Division as well as the Investigation and Operations Branches of the Sindh Police with a view to train them in the operation of the *Latent Fingerprint Systems*. As many as 55 officers attended these courses.

In pursuance of its aim to improve the professional capacity of Sindh Police, the German Federal Foreign Office Project is also committed to assist the Police in conducting specialized courses in Police Training Institutions throughout the Province of Sindh. With this objective, the project staff is working closely with the Training Branch and the "*Need Assessment Group*" of the Sindh Police. The German Federal Foreign Office Project and the Sindh Police have jointly conducted the following six Training of Trainer courses, with 200 Police Trainers of Sindh Police successfully attended the same.

- Training of Trainers "Method of instructions"
- First Responder Course
- Investigation Management Course
- Course for Duty Officers and Moharar
- Course for Station House Officers
- Basic Intelligence & Surveillance Course

Subsequent follow up courses have been conducted by the same Police Trainers of the Sindh Police and a training team of the German Federal Foreign Office Project at the Police Training College Saeedabad, Shahdadpur, Police Training School Larkana and Recruitment Training College Hyderabad. These trainings were attended by 4204 Police personnel.

The handing over ceremony was also attended by Additional Inspector Generals and Deputy Inspector Generals of the Sindh Police as well as the management of the Project.

IGP Sindh Ghulam Hyder Jamali while paying thanks to all GIZ officials and especially Government of Germany said that the addition of such sophisticated devices would enhance the investigation capability. "Sindh Police is determined in its drive against criminals and it will stay undeterred against all odds", he added.
