**ORDER.**

A Departmental Committee consisting of the following officers was constituted by the Inspector General of Police Sindh vide order No. 8303-10/E-II/Insp dated 22.05.2023 to examine the appointment/seniority case of Inspector Qurban Ali Mallah of Hyderabad Range:

2. The Committee held meeting in the office of AIGP Estate Management CPO Sindh, Karachi on 23.05.2023.

3. After perusal of the service record and all relevant documents, it has been observed that the above named appellant was appointed as Probationer ASI on 29.03.1990 in District Badin (Hyderabad Range). Subsequently, appellant (Inspector Qurban Ali Mallah) and others were discharged from service in the year 1991 on the grounds that their appointments were made on political basis by the then sitting Government. Later on, 167 discharged ASIs including appellant submitted appeals to Home Secretary Sindh for re-instatement into service. Such appeals were considered by a Sub-Committee in the Home Department Sindh. During pendency of such appeals in Home Department Sindh, the appellant ASI (now Inspector) was re-appointed as fresh Prob: ASI on 04.12.1991 by the then SSP District Hyderabad vide order No. 57878-85 dated 10.12.1991.

4. Besides, out of these 167 appeals, cases of 130 Ex-ASIs whose names were shown in the minutes of sub-committee meeting of Home Department Sindh held on 20.01.1993 were recommended to re-instate them into service including appellant. After due scrutiny by the said sub-committee, it transpired that no legal procedure was followed for termination of their services and that they were appointed after completion of all codal formalities and were found eligible for these posts. Therefore, the Sub-Committee of Home Department recommended their re-instatement into service from the date of joining/appointment. However, as per decision of said sub-committee they would not be entitled to any financial benefits for the period they remained out of service. They would retain their original seniority. The re-instatement of these ASIs had the approval of the then Chief Minister Sindh.

5. In view of the above decision of Sub-Committee of Home Department Sindh, the directions were issued by CPO Sindh with the approval of the then IGP Sindh to DIGP Hyderabad Range to issue formal orders for their re-instatement into service by the relevant SSsP including appellant Inspector Qurban Ali Mallah vide letter No. 22527-30/E-II dated 28.02.1993.

6. According to the above decision of Sub-Committee of Home Department Sindh as well as directives of CPO Sindh, the appellant Inspector Qurban Ali Mallah was required to be re-instated into service w.e.f 29.03.1990 and fresh appointment order as Prob: ASI w.e.f. 04.12.1991 was also required to be cancelled / withdrawn but this was not done at that time despite clear-cut instructions.

However, in the year 2012 appellant preferred an appeal to CPO Sindh for grant of seniority in the rank of ASI w.e.f. 29.03.1990 alongwith his batchmates as per above instructions of Home Department as well as CPO Sindh. His appeal was accepted by CPO Sindh and direction was issued to DIGP Hyderabad Range vide No. 6624/E-II/Insp dated 09.05.2012 to assign seniority to the appellant in the rank of ASI w.e.f. 29.03.1990 alongwith his batchmates.
